LLOYD W. J. AULTMAN-MOORE is an associate professor of philosophy at Waynesburg University. His interests include ancient Greek philosophy and literature, philosophy of religion, science and faith, biking, and ultimate Frisbee.

DAMIAN P. FEDORYKA earned his PhD in philosophy at the University of Salzburg and taught at various universities before serving as president of Christendom College. During and after his time as a professor of philosophy at the Franciscan University of Steubenville, Austrian campus, he also lectured extensively in post-Communist Ukraine, including at the Ukrainian Catholic University in Lviv, Ukraine. Fedoryka's interests include the personalist ethics of Dietrich von Hildebrand and the thought of Karol Wojtyła/Pope John Paul II. He is currently doing research at the Center for Personalist Anthropology and Ethics in Ypsilanti, Michigan.

H. WENDELL HOWARD is a professor emeritus of English at St. Fisher College in Rochester, New York. He is also retired as a choral conductor, a forty-year career that he began after receiving a diploma in voice from the Juilliard School of Music. He earned his PhD in

English and music from the University of Minnesota. As an author, he has published over 150 articles, poems, and chapters in books, and his work has appeared several times in the pages of *Logos*.

ROBERT C. KOERPEL is a doctoral candidate in historical and systematic theology in the School of Theology and Religious Studies at the Catholic University of America in Washington, D.C., and affiliate professor of theology at Loyola College in Maryland.

BASIL MEEKING, bishop emeritus of Christchurch, New Zealand, was born in New Zealand and was ordained a priest for the diocese of Christchurch in 1953. After obtaining a doctorate in theology at the University of St. Thomas in Rome and some years of pastoral work in New Zealand, he was for eighteen years an official and subsecretary of the Pontifical Council for Christian Unity in Rome. Then, for ten years he was bishop of Christchurch and after retirement was chaplain to the Sisters of St. Mary of Oregon; more recently he had been special assistant to Cardinal Francis George of Chicago. Last year he retired again to New Zealand.

WILLIAM F. MURPHY, JR., is an associate professor of moral theology at the Pontifical College Josephinum in Columbus, Ohio, and editor of the *Josephinum Journal of Theology*. He holds an STL from the Dominican House of Studies and an STD from the Pontifical John Paul II Institute for Studies on Marriage and Family, both in Washington, D.C. Murphy has published scholarly articles in moral theology, philosophy, and New Testament studies in various journals including *Pro Ecclesia*, *Communio*, *Studia Moralia*, *Nova et Vetera*, *Angelicum*, and *Sapientia*, among others. Most recently, he has edited and written a detailed introduction to a collection of essays by Martin Rhonheimer in fundamental moral philosophy, which is titled *The Perspective of the Acting Person: Essays in the Renewal of Thomistic Moral Philosophy*, from the Catholic University of America Press.

THOMAS W. SMITH is chair of the Humanities Department at Villanova University, where he also holds a joint appointment in political science. He is the author of *Revaluing Ethics* (SUNY Press, 2000) and his articles on ancient, medieval, and contemporary political thought have appeared in such journals as *American Political Science Review*, *Journal of Politics*, *Polis*, *Polity*, *Religion and Literature*, and the *Review of Politics*. He lives in Media, Pennsylvania, with his wife and three children.
