CHRISTOPHER O. BLUM is an associate professor at Christendom College in Front Royal, Virginia, where he teaches courses in modern European history and medieval culture. He recently edited *Critics of the Enlightenment: Readings in the French Counter-Revolutionary Tradition* (ISI Books). His essay is the fruit of studies begun in Burgundy in 1998 in a NEH Summer Seminar led by Stephen Murray of Columbia University.

EMMANUEL M. KATONGOLE is an associate research professor of theology and world Christianity at the Divinity School of Duke University and senior lecturer at the Institute of Ethics and Development Studies at Uganda Martyrs University, Nkozi, Uganda. He has published a number of books and articles on social ethics and African theology, among other topics. His current research interests include history, memory and violence in Africa. To this end he is involved in setting up a theological center for reconciliation at Duke University. He is a Catholic priest of the Kampala Archdiocese, Uganda.

LIVIO MELINA is a professor of moral theology at the John Paul II Institute for Studies on Marriage and Family at the Lateran University in Rome. In addition to numerous articles, he has written and coauthored several books, including *La conoscenza morale: Linee di riflessione sul Commento all'Etica Nicomachea*; *Morale: tra crisi e rinnovamento*; *Corso di Bioetica: Il Vangelo della vita*; *Amor conjugal y vocacion a la santidad*; *Sharing in Christ's Virtues*; *Cristo e il dinamismo dell'agire*; *L'agire morale del cristiano*.

PAUL MURRAY, OP, is a professor of spiritual theology at the Angelicum University in Rome and Spiritual Director at the Convitto Internazionale S. Tommaso. Among his theological publications are *The Mysticism Debate* (1977), *T. S. Eliot and Mysticism* (1991), and *Preachers at Prayer* (2004). He has also published four books of poetry, one of which was awarded Poetry Ireland Choice. His most recent volume of poetry is titled *These Black Stars* (2003).

MARINUS OSSEWAARDE completed his PhD at the London School of Economics and Political Science in 2002. He is currently a lecturer in sociology at the University of Twente (the Netherlands). A converted Christian, he is the author of *Tocqueville's Moral and Political Thought: New Liberalism* (London: Routledge, 2004).

JOHAN VERSTRAETEN is a professor of moral theology at Katholieke Universiteit, Leuven, Belgium, where he teaches business ethics; Catholic social thought; and ethics of peace, war, and international relations. He is chairman of the European Ethics Network and cofounder of the International Association for Catholic Social Thought. His recent publications include *Matter of Breath: Foundations for Professional Ethics* and *Catholic Social Thought: Twilight or Renaissance?*

ALICE VON HILDEBRAND is a professor emeritus at Hunter College of the City University of New York. She is the author of *The Soul of a Lion* (a biography of her late husband, Dietrich von Hildebrand, with a forward by Joseph Cardinal Ratzinger), *The Privilege of Being a Woman*, *By Love Refined*, and other books including books co-authored with her husband, as well as over eighty articles. She appears frequently on the Eternal Word Television Network (EWTN) and lectures extensively throughout the United States and the world.
