Application Checklist:

Apply for admission to the University of St. Thomas.

Complete this form and attach:

- One letter of recommendation from a teacher or school administrator.
- A one-page written essay explaining why a scholarship should be awarded to you. In the essay, include:
 - reasons why you wish to attend the University of St. Thomas.
 - any leadership activities, service organizations, or clubs in which you have participated (list and explain).
 - what you plan to do in the future to help others and/or future generations.
 - other evidence that supports why you should be awarded a scholarship to attend the University of St. Thomas.

Note: scholarship applications will not be reviewed until *all* of these items are received.

Deadlines:

- For fall term applicants: January 15th is the priority postmark deadline.
- For spring term applicants: September 15th is the priority postmark deadline.

Criteria:

- You must be a degree-seeking undergraduate non-immigrant visa holder and/or you will be applying for a non-immigrant visa to study in the United States; priority is given to F1 visa holders/applicants.
- You must show that you can finance at least \$15,000 per year of the cost of attendance at the University of St. Thomas.

Awards:

- Scholarships are based on merit and need.
- Scholarships are highly competitive and are limited to only a few awards offered yearly.
- The maximum award is full-tuition.
- Scholarships are available for one degree only.

Maintaining an Award:

- Scholarship recipients remain eligible to maintain the scholarship for the duration of their degree requirements: a maximum of eight semesters for undergraduate students.
- Scholarship recipients are expected to make regular progress toward the degree and maintain a 2.75 grade point average at the undergraduate level.
- Scholarship recipients are expected to participate in campus life and activities.
- Scholarship recipients who obtain an H1B visa status or permanent residency are not eligible to maintain an award.
