

Can you be an Aquinas Scholar?

To complete the program you will need to take three honors sections and three honors seminars. Seminars are usually taken as overloads or as J-term courses during the junior and senior years, so they do not present a significant obstacle to second-semester freshmen or sophomores who join the program. Honors sections, on the other hand, involve general requirements, some of which you will have completed by the end of the current semester. Will you have enough opportunities to take honors sections with your remaining general education requirements? To find out, complete the checklist on this page. Check the box next to any course you have *not* yet taken. If you check three or more boxes, then you can still complete the requirements of the honors program.

π First English Course

There are honors sections of English 190 offered in the fall.

π First Theology Course

There are honors sections of Theology 101 offered every semester

π First Philosophy Course

There are honors sections of Philosophy 115 offered every semester

π History Course

There is an honors section of History 113 offered every spring

π Lab Science Course(s)

There is a two-semester honors sequence of General Chemistry offered every year

π Math Course

There is an honors section of Math 114 (Calculus II) offered every spring

π Third Math/Science course

There is an honors section of QMCS 220 (Statistics) offered every fall

π Second Theology Course

There are two honors sections of 200-level Theology courses offered each semester

π Second Philosophy Course

There are honors sections of Philosophy 214 (Introductory Ethics) offered every semester

π Third Theology Course

There is at least one 300-level Theology course offered as an honors section each semester

π Social Analysis

Courses that fulfill this requirement and that are regularly offered as honors sections include:

Economics 252 Principles of Microeconomics
Sociology 100 Introduction to Sociology
Psychology 111 General Psychology

π Human Diversity

Honors sections of Sociology 100 (Introduction to Sociology) and Theology 331 (World Religions) meet the human diversity requirement
