Campus Phones

Parking

Information on parking and parking permits is available through Parking Services (651) 962-PARK. Beginning this fall, all students, faculty and staff must register for their permits online prior to purchase. More information on this process will be available at the Parking Services Web site, www.stthomas.edu/psps/Parking/Parking%20Home.htm. The registration form will be available after Aug. 4.

Commuter permits are on sale beginning at 8 a.m. on Aug. 24. Resident lottery forms must be returned to the Parking Services Office by 11 p.m. Monday, Aug. 31 and resident permits must be purchased by Sunday, Sept. 13. Public Safety will begin ticketing for "no valid permit" in all lots beginning at 6 p.m. Sunday, Sept. 13.

Escort Service

An escort is available 24 hours a day through Public Safety and Parking Services on campus or up to a six-block radius off campus. Call 2-5100 from any on-campus phone or (651) 962-5100 if you are off campus and need an escort to meet you. Student Escorts is a recognized student club and is always looking for more volunteers.

Night Access Program

UST residence halls are locked 24 hours a day. Every evening a night access person is on duty at the front

door to greet and coordinate the checking in and checking out of all guests. Opposite gender guests are welcome in the halls from 10 a.m. to midnight Sundays through Thursdays and 10 a.m. to 2 a.m. Fridays and Saturdays.
