On 12/03/2002, the Minneapolis Police Department shared the following information with the University of St. Thomas Department of Public Safety:

SEX OFFENDER INFORMATION FACT SHEET

RISK LEVEL 3 NOTIFICATION Minneapolis Police Department

The Minneapolis Police Department is releasing the following information pursuant to Minnesota Statutes 244.052, which authorizes law enforcement agencies to inform the public of a sex offender who has been released from custody regarding his criminal conviction. This disclosure is to inform you that the individual who appears on this notification has been convicted of a sex offense or other offense that requires registration with the local law enforcement agency that has jurisdiction over their residence. This offender has advised the Minneapolis Police Department that he is living in our community and is residing in the area of the **400 Block Of South 10th Street, The Downtown Neighborhood.**

THIS OFFENDER IS NOT WANTED BY THE POLICE AT THIS TIME.

This notification is not intended to increase fear. It is our belief that an informed public is a safer public. The Minneapolis Police Department has no legal authority to direct where a released offender may or may not live. Unless court ordered restrictions exist, an offender may live wherever he chooses.

Sex offenders have always lived in our communities but it was not until passage of the **Community Notification Bill** and **Sex Offender Registration Act** that law enforcement knew where they were living. Due to the passage of these laws, law enforcement can now share information with the public. Abuse of this information to threaten, intimidate, or harass registered sex offenders will not be tolerated and may be a crime. Such abuse could potentially end our ability to notify the community when sex offenders are released into the public.

The Minneapolis Police Department is available to help you by providing you with useful information on personal safety. The Minneapolis Police SAFE Unit may be contacted at **673-2923** assist you in forming block clubs and receiving information on crime prevention. They will also provide tips to instruct your children on personal safety.

THE RELEASED OFFENDER:

DESCRIPTION OF OFFENDER:

African American Male, 6'1", 180 Lbs, Slender Build, Brown Eyes, Black Hair, Dark Brown Complexion, And A Light Mustache. *This Offender Also Uses The Name Of Keir Crockson.

DESCRIPTION OF OFFENSE:

This offender has a prior history of engaging in acts of sexual contact with male and female victims from age 15 to adult. This contact includes acts of fondling and penetration. The offender was acquainted with all of his victim's. He is currently on probation for previously failing to register a valid home address and was therefore out of compliance.

CONDITIONS OF RELEASE: Supervised Release Date Expired 12/23/01

- No direct/indirect contact with previous victim's.
- May not use chemicals to include alcohol or drugs.
- Must obtain and maintain full time employment.
- Must cooperate with any chemical dependency assessments and complete any and all related programs as directed.
- Must comply with all requests to submit to tests for the purpose of determining any level of substance abuse.
