The Department of Public Safety would like to inform the University of St. Thomas community of a robbery that occurred off campus at the Grand Avenue and Cleveland Avenue Super America.

On 01/13/2003, at approximately 10:55 p.m., the St. Paul Police were dispatched to an armed robbery that had apparently just taken place at the Super America convenience store located at 2051 Grand Avenue.

The suspect was described as a white male, unknown age and height, thin build with brown hair, wearing a black ski mask and a dark green Green Bay Packers jersey with the number "96" and the name "JONES" on the back. The suspect was armed with what was described as a butcher knife.

The suspect in the robbery fled the scene on foot, heading northbound on Cleveland Avenue.

The St. Paul Police Department is investigating this crime. If you have any information about this crime, you are urged to call the St. Paul Police Department at (651) 291-1111 or the Department of Public Safety Investigator Mike Barrett at (651) 962-5106.

If you are held up:

- Don't take unnecessary risks.
- Don't resist. No amount of money is worth taking chances with your life.
- Report these crimes immediately to Public Safety and the Police. Try to remember the description of the perpetrator, including approximate age, height, weight and details on hair, clothing, jewelry, scars, tattoos – anything noticeable.

Immediately call the Department of Public Safety at (96)2-5555 if you see suspicious people loitering or lurking on or around campus. **Please note the physical description of the suspect(s), the last known location and direction of travel, and if applicable a vehicle license plate number.** The earlier Public Safety is notified of suspicious activity, the better chance of apprehension.
