General Information

Public Safety would like to advise the UST community of recent vehicle related crimes that have occurred near university property.

On 2/15/2006 at 5:41 PM, a UST student who had parked her vehicle at Summit Avenue and Mississippi River Boulevard, reported that the passenger side window had been smashed in and her purse, which did not contain any money or personal property, was stolen.

On 2/16/2006 at 10:44 PM, a UST student who had parked his vehicle on Selby Avenue reported that the vehicle had been stolen. The vehicle was a white 2-door Honda Civic CX.

On 2/17/2006 at 3:20 PM, a UST student who had parked his vehicle on Selby Avenue reported that the passenger side window had been smashed and his stereo was stolen.

Public Safety requests assistance with solving and preventing these crimes.

The following tips will assist you in protecting yourself from becoming the victim of these crimes.

- Always lock your doors
- Keep windows closed and rolled up tight
- Never leave personal property in plain view in your vehicle
- Never leave valuables anywhere in your vehicle, including your trunk
- Clearly label CD's with an identifying mark to aid investigators in the recovery of property
- Always report suspicious activity to Public Safety and the police:
