Public Safety would like to alert the University of St. Thomas community of a suspicious incident that occurred off campus.

At approximately 10:00 p.m. Friday, June 16th, a St. Thomas student reported that she saw an unidentified male looking into her bedroom window at her residence on Lincoln Avenue. The student's boyfriend ran outside to see if he could locate the suspect, but the suspect had fled the scene. The St. Paul Police Department was contacted, but SPPD officers were unable to locate the suspect upon search of the area.

The suspect is described as a white male in his 30's, approximately 6 feet tall, with dark shaggy hair, dark eyebrows, and wearing a white t-shirt. The student also advised that a similar incident happened at her residence approximately one month ago, and she believes it involved the same suspect.

The description of the suspect is similar to the description of the suspect in an incident reported to the UST community on 06/07/2006, involving an unidentified individual looking into a UST student's window on Dayton Avenue.

Crime prevention tips:

- Remember suspect information, including approximate age, height, weight and details on hair, clothing, jewelry, scars, tattoos – anything noticeable.
- Report crimes immediately to Public Safety and the police.
- Use the Public Safety Escort Service to accompany you to your destination.
- Walk with groups of people – there is safety in numbers.
- Don't take unnecessary risks. Stay in populated, well-lit areas.
- Use a buddy system with your trusted friends to watch out for one another.
