General Information

In addition to the alert posted on 11/20/2006, Public Safety has become aware of another robbery involving a UST community member.

At approximately 07:00 p.m. Sunday, November 19th, a St. Thomas student reported that he had been robbed by two black males while he was walking southbound on Cleveland Avenue. As the student approached Goodrich Avenue, the suspects came up behind him and demanded his backpack and the contents of his pockets. The student gave the suspects his backpack and everything in his pockets.

After relinquishing his personal property, one of the suspects struck the student on the left side of the face, injuring his mouth and giving him a concussion. The student reported that the suspects fled north on Cleveland Avenue. The student later sought medical attention for his injuries.

The first suspect is described as a black male, approximately 5' 9" tall, wearing a black hooded sweatshirt. The second suspect is described as a black male, approximately 6' tall, also wearing a black hooded sweatshirt.

A report was filed with Public Safety and the St. Paul Police Department.

- Walk in groups – there is safety in numbers.

- Remember suspect information, including approximate age, height, weight and details on hair, clothing, jewelry, scars, tattoos – anything noticeable.
- Use a buddy system with your trusted friends to watch out for one another.
