Public Safety would like to inform the University of St. Thomas community of the following Safety Alert received from the Minneapolis Community and Technical College Public Safety department

MCTC Safety Alert

On December 13, 2006 at 12:30PM a female student reported that a friend drove her to school and was dropped off at the intersection of Yale and Spruce (Near Fine Arts). Upon exiting the vehicle a vehicle pulled up behind them. The passenger door to the vehicle swung open and the man inside told her to "get in". The student advised the driver that her friend was right there. The suspect vehicle sped off. The driver of the victim vehicle attempted to follow the suspect vehicle, but was unable to obtain a license plate number. The victim reported the incident to the Minneapolis Police Department.

Age: Early 20's
Hair: Light Brown/Short
Facial Hair: None
Clothing: Wearing a Red Winter Jacket

Suspect Vehicle Description:

Make: Toyota
Model: Camry
Year: Early 90's
Color: Gray or Light Blue
Other: Vehicle was loud as if without muffler

- Use a buddy system with your trusted friends to watch out for one another.
