### **MACALESTER SAFETY BULLETIN**

On Monday, August 13, an unidentified individual was reported entering various buildings looking for unlocked doors and desk drawers. There have been several thefts reported and this person may have been involved. The suspect is described as:

Gender – Male

Skin tone – Dark

Age – 20's

Height – 6 foot

Build – Thin

Appearance - Very neat, close cut facial hair

Clothing – ¾ length Blue Jeans, White T-shirt or a Short Sleeve Blue shirt or no shirt at all.

May be riding a bicycle

Please make sure your personal and college property is locked up. Do not leave your office unlocked even for a few minutes!

If you see any strangers, strange behaviors, or a person matching the description above, immediately call Macalester Security at (651) 696-6555.

### **UST Public Safety crime prevention tips:**

- Lock your office or residence hall room door, even if you are home.
- It takes eight seconds for a thief to enter a room or office and leave with your valuables.
- More than 90 percent of room and office thefts involve occupants who were “just gone for a few moments.”
- Be alert to any people in buildings or residence halls who appear suspicious. You know the areas that you live and work in best. If in doubt, notify Public Safety.
- Do not leave your purses, laptops, wallets, cash or other valuables unsecured in plain sight or unattended in public areas for even a short period of time.
- Remember suspect information, including approximate age, height, weight and details on hair, clothing, jewelry, scars, tattoos - anything noticeable.
