

BOUNDARY DILEMMAS IN SUPERVISION

What is the video recording about?

The video recording presents a three-stage model that is useful for identification of troublesome boundary dilemmas in the supervisory relationship. It illustrates, via a series of vignettes combined with narration by Marilyn Peterson Armour, a continuum of severity that moves from challenge to violation,

The information in the video can be used as an early warning system for supervisors and can be a preventative tool in the area of client abuse. In addition to enhancing the supervisor's ability to recognize boundary dilemmas, the video assists supervisors in growing and using the power of their role to set limits and to teach supervisees about boundaries.

While the vignettes focus on student-supervisee relationships, they can easily be generalized to other supervisory relationships.
