**\*Most of our students who go on to major in French place into FREN 211, 212, or 300 in the first semester. In the unusual case where a student were to begin at the 111 or 112 level, the major is still feasible, but the student would need to take FREN 211 during the summer (or spring for those starting at 112 in the fall) before the sophomore year. They would then take 212 fall semester and 300 spring semester of the sophomore year, and three upper-level courses during the junior year and three during the senior year.**
