*Most of our students who go on to major in Spanish place into Span 211, 212, or 300 in the first semester. In the unusual case that a student were to begin at the 111 or 112 level, the major is still feasible, but the student would need to take Span 301 and Span 305 during the same semester and take three Span courses during one of the semesters of senior year. Students beginning at Span 212 or 300, on the other hand, would be able to spread out the courses listed above for the senior year over multiple years.
