German & Engineering Dual Degree Program

Five-Year Financial Aid Plan

To help plan your finances for the five-year German & Engineering dual degree program, review the year-by-year financial aid process:

All Years

- St Thomas Merit Scholarship awarded during the admission process and renewed.
- Submit a Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA), if applicable, to apply for any federal, state, university or private grants, scholarships, work-study, or loans. Most financial aid programs are awarded for fall and spring semester, require full-time enrollment (12 or more credits per semester) and that a student is compliant with the <u>satisfactory academic progress policy</u>.
- Review any scholarship letters, the financial aid award notice, and year-specific award guide for other requirements. Eligibility for financial aid is determined annually based on the regulations and rules for each program, including limitations on the number of terms of eligibility, cumulative limits, etc.
- Submit a St Thomas January term or Summer Session <u>financial aid application</u>, if desired, at the time you register for coursework to apply for loan funding to assist with the costs to attend these optional terms.
- ❖ In late fall/early winter, explore upcoming school year scholarship opportunities and deadlines, especially the School of Engineering continuing student scholarships.

Year 3: Add the following

❖ In late fall/early winter, explore fourth year scholarship opportunities with the Study Abroad Office.

Year 4: Additional items

- Instead of attending both terms on campus, as a dual-degree student, you will enroll at St Thomas for 12 or more credits to study abroad for fall semester.
- The St Thomas Merit Scholarship will be renewed for one semester only. This will be for the term studying abroad.
- The financial aid office will use a budget prepared by the study abroad office to determine your merit scholarship and other financial aid for the study abroad semester. If the study abroad costs are less than the same term at St Thomas, your scholarship and financial aid awards will be reduced.
- Work study funding is not available for study-abroad.
- ❖ No financial aid can be provided for the term with the 0-credit internship

Year 5: Additional Items

- St Thomas Merit Scholarship is renewed for two semesters based on your enrollment in ENGR 305-03 and your designation as a student in this dual program. For this specific dual degree program, the financial aid office will automatically grant this as an exception.
- ❖ It is during the 9th or 10th semester of school when limits on funding may be reached or when a student who transferred in coursework may be required to submit a satisfactory academic progress policy appeal.

Student loan Information

Borrowers will begin to use their grace period* and may enter <u>loan repayment</u> during their 0-credit internship experience during Year 4.

- During the winter break, complete <u>Student Loan Exit Counseling</u>.
- If you borrowed any private loans, contact the lender directly to discuss your repayment options.
- To maintain an in-school status, and not begin repayment, a student must be enrolled at least half-time. This is a federal regulation. For the University of St Thomas, this is a minimum of six credits.
- Enrollment status is reported by the university as often as monthly. (This schedule may vary slightly for non-standard terms, such as summer and J-term.)
- Although the idea of early repayment can be unsettling, there are options available to postpone repayment, if needed.

Student borrowers have three choices to consider regarding loan repayment:

- 1. Enroll in at least six credits for the summer following the internship, with at least one class starting in Summer Session I to avoid repayment completely.
- 2. Start repayment. If the calculated monthly payment causes financial hardship, discuss this with your federal loan servicer to determine if you may qualify for an income driven repayment plan. (This may lower the monthly payment amount. If income is zero, the monthly payment may be zero.) Utilize the Loan Simulator on the studentaid.gov website to estimate a monthly payment based on your current federal student loan balance.
- 3. If you are not ready for loan repayment, contact your federal loan servicer to discuss postponement options. There is a forbearance option to postpone the loan payment completely. Log into studentaid.gov to locate federal loan servicer information on your dashboard.

*Note: The six-month grace period will be used up on federal loans borrowed prior to the 0-credit internship if you choose to either not enroll or be less than half-time enrollment status for summer.
