1. What is STAR?

As a student programming board at the University of St. Thomas, STAR (St. Thomas Activities and Recreation) is committed to providing opportunities for students to interact and develop relationships with other students outside of their time in the classroom. STAR is allocated a portion of the student activity fee and uses that money to provide a variety of engaging events for students including live music, movies, bingo, game shows, trivia, DIY crafts, excursions (off-campus trips throughout the Twin Cities) and so more. STAR provides programming and support for Out of State and Transfer students, where you can join in community with one another through special events and other opportunities. STAR also provides engagement opportunities for each class cohort as you navigate various stages of life as a college student.
