That said, you can accommodate all of your basic needs in the comfort of your St. Thomas residence hall room, including late night feedings, entertainment and expressive décor. This guide will make your move go smoothly by helping you check off the right boxes – and leave the others at home.







Past student experience tells us you're going to want these:

- ✓ Non-halogen lamps
- ✓ Bathroom items and a caddy to carry them
- UL-listed surge protectors
- Removable wall hardware (i.e. blue painters' tape, push pins)
- ✓ Laundry basket and bag, detergent and perhaps softener
- ✓ TV/gaming system/computer (with lock cable)
- ✓ Noise machine (to help with sleep)
- Small refrigerator (under 4.5 cubic feet)
- ✓ Microwave (1,000 watts or less)
- ✓ Fan (to cool and help with sleep)
- "U" style bike lock (if bringing a bike)
- ✓ Padlock/Combination lock for desk cabinet
- ✓ Coffeepot/Keurig



If it sparks, sizzles or smells, leave it behind.

- ✗ Used furniture including beds and couches (health and safety concerns)
- ✗ Air conditioner (even floor units are not allowed)
- ★ Hot plates/hot pots
- ✗ Electric cooking devices (including sandwich makers, George Foreman grills, toasters, air fryers, etc.)
- **✗** Space heaters
- ★ Halogen lamps
- **✗** Extension cords/multi-plug units that aren't surge protected

- ✗ Nails/screws/double-sided tape or other permanent wall hardware like TV wall mounts
- **X** Candles/incense
- Firearms or weapons (including BB guns, paintball guns, air guns, knives, and decorative weapons)
- ✗Tobacco products/e-cigs (St. Thomas is tobacco-free)
- ✗ Hoverboards (banned for fire hazard)

Oo I need to use the service providers in this brochure to purchase linens, furniture or appliances?

A No, we offer this information to give you the benefit of our experience with reputable, affordable services.
