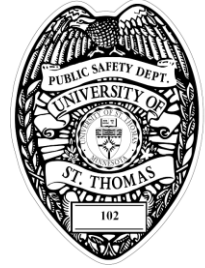

General Information

Public Safety would like to notify the University of St. Thomas community about a vehicle theft that occurred on the St. Paul campus near the Saint Paul Seminary.

On 1/20/2023 at 11:06 AM, A St. Thomas student reported their vehicle was stolen to Public Safety and the St. Paul Police Department. Public Safety discovered through reviewing camera footage the vehicle theft occurred on 1/19/2023 at 11:09 PM. The suspects gained entry to the vehicle by breaking the passenger window.

The two suspects abandoned a separate stolen vehicle (reported stolen out of the City of Minneapolis) in LOT P prior to stealing the student's vehicle in LOT Y. Through reviewing camera footage suspect one appears to be a male, approximately 5'8" to 6" tall, medium build, wearing a black hooded sweatshirt, red sweatpants, and dark-colored tennis shoes. Suspect two appears to be a male, approximately 5' 7" to 5' 11", skinny build, wearing a black hooded sweatshirt, black pants, and white and black tennis shoes.

The University of St. Thomas believes that descriptors alone are not a valid reason to profile or cast suspicion on any individual. They are included here because they may reasonably assist in identifying the perpetrator of this incident.

Crime prevention tips:

- Park your vehicle in well-lit areas.
- Do not leave your vehicle unlocked and removed keys from your vehicle.
- Do not leave valuables in your vehicle.
- Think about using a steering wheel, brake, or tire lock.
- Check on your vehicle frequently.
- Report crimes immediately to Public Safety and the St. Paul Police Department.
