Have you ever thought about where your food comes from, and why it matters that we know? Have you considered the intersections of diet and health, or food and medicine? In this seminar, we will take a close look at the Twin Cities food scene and discuss ways that various food movements–local, organic, health, urban farming, social justice–have taken root here, shaped our food options, and mobilized communities. We will read excerpts from fiction, nonfiction, journalism, and cookbooks; readings will include the full novel *Kitchens of the Great Midwest* by J. Ryan Stradel and excerpts from *Animal, Vegetable, Miracle* by Barbara Kingsolver, *Original Local: Indigenous Food, Stories, and Recipes from the Upper Midwest* by Heid E. Erdrich, *Decolonize Your Diet* by Carolina Rueda Esquibel, and others. We will venture out into the field to see real-world examples of how local activists, businesses, nonprofits, and restaurants are participating in these movements to eat better and make a difference.
