9:00am – Directors Updates

1. NCHC

- c. Paige is thinking of making the mentorship program a three-week deal so that's there's less pressure on everyone involved—beyond the three weeks, mentors/mentees can make of the relationship and program what they wish
- d. Paige sent out a survey to mentor and mentees and found that it was extremely beneficial for mentors to be paired with a mentee pursuing the same major, and also found that the more communication the better
- e. Going forward, it's agreed that more structure is needed to make the program more efficient

9. Spring Election Details

- a. Election Process issues from last year and possible change for this year
 - i. Last year, the election process was a little unorganized and people weren't necessarily getting the positions they wanted; also people weren't in attendance so they weren't adequately represented
 - ii. Proposal for this year: everyone will send Carolyn their first choice only for positions, and we will start with the academic, social, service, etc. chairs and then work our way up to the executive board positions. Then there will be a second round of voting for people's second choices. Then a third round of voting for people's third choices until all positions that need to be filled, are filled.

- iii. The document containing rules/regulations for the current election process is on Dropbox and will have to be updated; it should be updated, sent to the current student board, and finalized before implemented this spring
