Aquinas Scholars Academic Qualifications for Instruction

One-Professor Seminars

Instructors teaching one-professor seminars for the Aquinas Scholars Honors Program should have previous teaching experience at the University of St. Thomas and hold a minimum of a Master's Degree in a related discipline to the seminar being taught. This corresponds to the qualifications as stated in the University of St. Thomas Academic Qualifications policy. Faculty teaching one-professor seminars need not be full-time faculty of the University.

Two-Professor Seminars

Faculty team teaching two-professor seminars for the Aquinas Scholars Honors Program must have one faculty member with previous teaching experience at the University of St. Thomas that holds a minimum of a Master's Degree in a related field to the seminar being taught. This corresponds to the qualifications as stated in the University of St. Thomas Academic Qualifications policy.

The second faculty member teaching a two-professor seminar may be considered if they:

- Demonstrate **#** years of experience + bachelor's degree in a related discipline to the seminar being taught.
- Bear professional certification + <mark># years</mark> of experience in a related discipline to the seminar being taught.
- Have evidence of extensive and excellent work or research experience in a related discipline to the seminar being taught, judged on a case-by-case basis by the Aquinas Scholars Faculty Board.

Honors Courses

Faculty teaching honors courses that bear a heading other than HONR will need to meet the minimum qualifications of the department of record.
