GREGORY R. BEABOUT is Associate Professor of Philosophy at St. Louis University and Adjunct Scholar at the Center for Economic Personalism. His publications include *Freedom and Its Misuses, A Celebration of the Thought of John Paul II*, and *Beyond Self-Interest*.
