Requirements for Major

Forty-four credits in major, no more than 12 credits of which may be at the 100-level and at least 16 credits of which must be numbered HIST 300 or above.

Europe since 1450: HIST 222, 223, 225, 226, 322, 328, 333, 335, 394

The Americas and Their Colonial Antecedents: HIST 210, 211, 262, 263, 353, 355, 358, 365, 366, 372, 396

History of Africa, Asia, Latin America, or the Middle East: HIST 240, 241, 244, 253, 348, 349, 395
