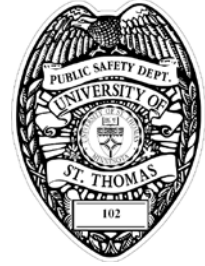

Public Safety would like to inform the University of St. Thomas community about a suspicious person peering into a window on the 2000 block of Dayton Avenue.

On 03/22/2018 at approximately 1105 hours, A St. Thomas student reported the peering of a male into a first floor house window.

The student stated on 03/21/2018 at approximately 2030 hours, she and her mother saw an unidentified Caucasian male described as approximately 65 year of age, 5' 8" to 6' tall, medium build, white or gray hair, scruffy white facial hair, big black furry Russian style hat, glasses, and a navy blue jacket with white stripes, peering into a first floor window of a house. After confronting the male, he walked away in an unknown direction.

The St. Thomas student and her mother contacted St. Paul Police Department to report the incident.

The St. Thomas community is strongly encouraged to contact Public Safety and the St. Paul Police Department and ask the call takers to speak directly with an officer within both departments should they face a similar incident.

***The University of St. Thomas believes that descriptors alone are not a valid reason to profile or cast suspicion on any individual. They are included here because they may reasonably assist in identifying the perpetrators of this incident.***

Crime prevention tips:

- Report crimes immediately to the police and Public Safety.
- Keep all doors and windows locked, even when you are home.
- Report any damaged or malfunctioning locks, doors, or windows immediately to your landlord for repair.
- Reinforce doors with deadbolt locks.
- Reinforce sliding doors or windows with wooden or metal rods placed in the slide track.
- Do not open doors for strangers.
- If you see suspicious persons at your door or on your property, contact the police immediately.
- Remember suspect information, including approximate age, height, weight and details on hair, clothing, jewelry, scars, tattoos, vehicle information and last direction of travel - anything noticeable.
- Call Public Safety to escort you to your destination.
- Stay in populated, well-lit areas. Walk in groups – Don't take unnecessary risks.
