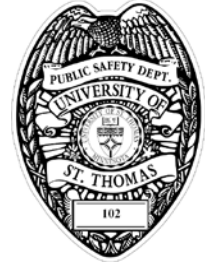

General Information

Public Safety would like to advise the University of St. Thomas community of an indecent exposure incident in Monument park near the St. Paul campus.

On 09/02/2018 at approximately 1:25 pm, a St. Thomas student reported while walking near the Mississippi River on a dirt trail in Monument Park, a male was standing near the woods on a dirt trail touching his genitals. The student told Public Safety the suspect made eye contact and continued touching his genitals as the student began to run past him.

The suspect remained in the same location and the student ran from the area.

The student described the suspect as 5'08" – 5'11", white male, approximately 20 to 30 years of age, short brown hair, brown patchy beard, wearing a green short-sleeved t-shirt, black baggy pants, possibly wearing a dark baseball hat and standing with a dark-colored bicycle.

Public Safety and the St. Paul Police Department conducted a search of the area and were unable to locate the suspect.

The University of St. Thomas believes that descriptors alone are not a valid reason to profile or cast suspicion on any individual. They are included here because they may reasonably assist in identifying the perpetrator of this incident.
