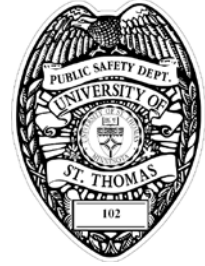

General Information

Public Safety would like to inform the University of St. Thomas community of an armed robbery that occurred near the intersection of Summit Avenue and Mississippi River Boulevard.

On 09/30/2017 at approximately 08:00 PM, the St. Paul Police Department responded to the area of the intersection near Monument Park. According to SPPD three unidentified suspects robbed four unidentified victims believed to be affiliated with UST. One of the Suspects was later arrested by Minneapolis Police Department in a stolen vehicle. The two other suspects are still at large. While the suspects have not been identified, we do not believe they are affiliated with this St. Thomas. Further, there is believed to be no ongoing threat to the campus community.

This incident is being actively investigated by SPPD.

Crime prevention tips:

- Report crimes immediately to Public Safety and the police.
- Don't risk your safety over valuables.
- Know brand, model and serial # of valuables.
- Remember suspect information, including direction of travel, vehicle information, approximate age, height, weight and details on hair, clothing, jewelry, scars, and tattoos – anything noticeable.
