General Information

Public Safety would like to notify the University of St. Thomas community of three burglaries that occurred in Flynn Residence Hall on 12/05/2018 at approximately 4:43 PM.

A St. Thomas student reported an unidentified female suspect searching through his unlocked apartment. When confronted, the suspect said she was looking for a friend and left the apartment. The student reported nothing stolen from the apartment.

A St. Thomas student reported the same unidentified female suspect entered his unlocked apartment and opened the door to his bedroom. The suspect said she was looking for "Peter" and left the apartment. The student reported nothing stolen from the apartment.

A St. Thomas student reported an unidentified female suspect entered her unlocked apartment and bedroom. The suspect said she was there to meet her friend "Angela", and left the area when told no one by that name lived in the apartment. The student later noticed cash missing from the apartment and immediately called Public Safety.

Public Safety officers met the suspect as she was leaving the building. The suspect refused to identify herself, and ran from campus to a black Chrysler Pacifica parked on Selby Avenue. The suspect and vehicle fled westbound from the area on Selby Avenue.

It was determined that the suspect gained access to Flynn Residence Hall by following someone into the building as another person was leaving.

The suspect was described by students and video recordings as a black female, approximately 5' tall, medium build, approximately 40 years of age, black hair in a ponytail, metal hooped earrings, wearing a black knee length coat with a hood, brown or red leggings, large black purse, large metal ring on left hand, and black and white sneakers. The suspect's vehicle is a black Chrysler Pacifica

The University of St. Thomas believes that descriptors alone are not a valid reason to profile or cast suspicion on any individual. They are included here because they may reasonably assist in identifying the perpetrator of this incident.

- Walk in groups – there is safety in numbers.
