

About the Artist

HYEON JEONG holds the Doctor of Musical Arts Degree in Organ Performance from the University of Michigan, where she received the prestigious Regent Fellowship. During her study, she was awarded many honors such as the Rackham Grant and Dean's Grant from the University of Michigan, the Graduate Scholarship from the University of Cincinnati, and the Presidential Honor from Yonsei University.

Since graduation she has taught at Indiana University-Purdue University in Indianapolis, and currently serves as Associate Organist and Choirmaster at Saint Michael and All Angels Church in Dallas, one of the largest Episcopal churches in the United States.

She is the First Prize Winner of the Fort Wayne National Organ Competition and the Flint International Organ Competition. Her other awards include the top prize in the Mader National Organ Competition and the first runner-up prize in the Dublin-Ireland International Organ Competition. She also received a medal as one of four Lauréats in the *Concours International d'Orgue Grand Prix de Chartres*. Dr. Jeong keeps an active recital schedule throughout North America, Europe, and Asia and has been featured on many broadcasts including MPR's internationally broadcast *Pipedreams*. In addition to giving many organ recitals, she frequently performs on harpsichord as both soloist and ensemble member.
